Membership Meeting Minutes Dec. 4, 2014

We began our Christmas meeting with a potluck at 6:30 p.m. at the Palmer Depot. President Marcia Healy welcomed our special guests, Lost at C, a barbershop quartet who entertained us with wonderful Christmas songs while we finished eating.

We had 69 members signing in tonight. December birthdays were celebrated and our Greeter (Judy Morrison) and Mentor (Lois Munford) were introduced. Linda Markus made a motion to accept the November membership meeting minutes as published in the newsletter, Sue Peterson seconded, the motion passed.

Committee Reports

Retreat Chair Raye Kruger said the dates of retreat are February 19-22 with a theme of Up, Up and Away. Starting December 8, you should be able to register for retreat on our website, plus we are taking deposits starting tonight. The next retreat committee meeting is December 10 at 5:30 p.m. at Raye's office.

Raffle Quilt Chair Elaine Fergen announced that we need someone to quilt the 2015 raffle quilt and have a budget of up to \$300 to pay for this.

Grant Chair Elaine Fergen said she will be stepping down as Chair of this committee. If anyone is interested in taking over this position, contact Elaine.

Hospitality - Sue Petersen said that since no one signed up to help with organizing and setting up for tonight's potluck, there were no decorations on the tables. She also reminded us that when food is brought for the potluck, it needs to be ready to serve (cakes and pies cut into serving pieces, etc.). Sue has been doing cleanup after our meetings for several years and she will be moving out of state in January, so other members need to step up to take over hospitality duties.

Quilt Camp - Linda Rudolph announced that quilt camp will be April 30-May 3 with a theme of Scrappy and Done. Shirley Heintzman will be teaching a bargello class at camp.

CASA Representative Debby Hudson reported on the recent quilt auction. She said 91 quilters donated 196 quilts and of those, 40 Valley Quilters Guild members donated 93 quilts. She thanked the guild for all their donations and assistance. She will have a full report in the next newsletter.

Education Chair Marcia Harlamert announced some of the projects planned for 2015: a batik fat quarter challenge (must be done by October), a mystery quilt will start in January and will be explained on the website, and we will again do the bucket list. The final Education committee meeting for 2014 will be December 12 at the Palmer Library at 10:30 a.m. They will also work on planning for 2016 at this meeting. Marcia then gave the Education Minute.

Unfinished Business

Marcia Healy said that the Palmer Museum will be displaying quilts starting December 12, if anyone is interested in submitting a quilt to display, contact Marcia. Also, Pat Ott is coordinating a quilt display at the Wasilla Museum. They would like Log Cabin or Courthouse Steps patterns, including antique quilts with these designs. Also, snowman themed quilts can be displayed. You can drop these off at Sylvia's Quilt Depot or contact Pat (355-4104) if you have one to display.

Our January 8 membership meeting will be at St. Michael Catholic Church, 432 E. Fireweed, in Palmer, since the Depot will be unavailable due to renovations. Marcia Healy said she needs help setting up tables before the meeting. She asked for people to meet at 5:00 p.m. and there is a signup sheet for this.

New Business

Treasurer Judy Foster thanked the group who worked on the 2015 budget: Roseann Chalker, Elaine Fergen, Marcia Healy, Carol Hepler, Debby Hudson, Terry Metier, Cindy Montague, and Rafa Wright. Elaine Fergen made a motion to accept the budget as presented, Melanie Hancock seconded, motion passed.

Marcia Healy said we had been contacted about another quilt display at the Winter Solstice Festival, at Palmer Middle School on Dec 20. If anyone is interested, please see Marcia.

Quilts of Valor - Linda Kau said they presented 160 quilts this year to Veterans. She thanked everyone for their work on making a lot of these quilts. They are meeting on December 11 from 10-4 at St. Michael Church to sew on Quilts of Valor quilts and KTUU News is supposed to be there to film. The segment should be on the news that night.

Announcements

We need to take anything we'll need in January out of the Depot this month, as we won't have access in January. Also, Service will not have their items at the January meeting, so if you take a project tonight, you'll have until February to complete it.

Those who worked on the Palmer Quilt or submitted quilts for display at the Palmer Museum should be getting an invitation to the Museum reception on December 12. The quilt will be at the Museum on December 12 and 13 for the public to sew on.

Our next membership meeting is January 8 at St. Michael Catholic Church. The program is Yoga for Quilters by Ailis Vann. **Open Sew for January is CANCELLED.**

The next Board meeting is December 9 at the MTA Building. This is a different day than usual, as the meeting room was not available on our normal day.

After everyone showed off the ornaments they received in the ornament exchange, we had Show and Tell and the drawings. Blocks were won by Jeannie Snodgrass. Fat quarters were won by Mary Lou Michel, Kandis Kile, Terry Metier, and Barbara Emrick. The door prizes were provided by Ruth Simpson and were won by Marcia Healy, Paula Hunt, Sharon Horwath, and Deborah Kessler. The raffle basket this month is from Dina's Cozy Cabin Quilts and was won by Dorothy Heintzman.

Our meeting adjourned at 9:10 p.m.

Board Meeting Minutes Dec. 9, 2014

President Marcia Healy called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. at the MTA meeting room. Those present were President Marcia Healy, Treasurer Judy Foster, Parliamentarian Cat Thompson, Secretary Ann Davis, Librarian Roseann Chalker, Service Committee Chair Patty Livingston, Education Committee Chair Marcia Harlamert, and Raffle Quilt Committee Chair Elaine Fergen.

Judy Foster made a motion to accept the November 13 Board meeting minutes as printed in the December newsletter, Roseann Chalker seconded, motion passed.

Unfinished Business

Marcia Healy reported that we now have a cart for the AccuquiltGO which is in the storage room at the Depot. Service is planning to buy a 2-1/2" die.

POLICY CLARIFICATION - at the November 13, 2014 Board meeting, we voted to modify our current policy to request a 10% donation of the gross raffle ticket sales when another organization borrows our raffle permit. Judy Foster made a motion to clarify this policy as follows: The Guild will suggest a 10% donation of the gross raffle ticket sales when another organization borrows our raffle permit. Roseann Chalker seconded, motion passed.

The Board discussed how to publish new or modified policies so that all Members will be aware of the policy. We decided to post it in the Board meeting minutes, but to make sure it was annotated as a policy addition or modification and to put the information in correct policy language.

POLICY CLARIFICATION - All items to be posted on the Valley Quilters Guild website will be submitted to the Web Liaison for approval.

At the November 14, 2013, Board meeting, we voted to give the Webmaster free membership and one free class attendance per year. Judy Foster made a motion to discontinue this policy, Roseann Chalker seconded, motion passed.

New Business

Marcia Healy reported that we had an unauthorized use of our Guild roster. She contacted the person directly and explained that this is not acceptable.

We discussed what constitutes a lifetime member of the guild. Our policy requires 10 consecutive years of membership and age 65. We decided the 10 consecutive years do not need to be just prior to age 65 (i.e., age 55-65), but any 10 consecutive years, even if there is a break in membership.

Marcia Healy brought up the topic of updating committee and board boxes/files. The Board liaison appointed to be on each committee is responsible for getting the committee to keep their boxes up-to-date.

Committee Reports

Service Committee Chair Patty Livingston said another sale of excess items is planned for early 2015, probably in March. She said if other committees have items in the store room they want to get rid of, they would be welcome to add the items to the sale. Roseann Chalker said she will probably have more library books to sell.

The Valley Quilters Guild brochure has been updated and will be reprinted in time to have available at Colony Christmas and the quilt show at the Wasilla Museum in January.

Mail/announcements/suggestions

Thank you notes from the MatSu Food Bank and Beverly Winkler were read. We also received a packet of information on the Sisters, Oregon Quilt Show from Lyn Grunland.

A comment from the suggestion box was read. The writer was concerned that the Board has not been addressing suggestions/comments and did not feel they should have to sign their name in order for their item to be addressed. Board response - From now on, we will summarize concerns we receive and will include them in the Board meeting minutes. The Board agreed that suggestions/comments do not have to be signed.

A suggestion was read regarding programs for the Valley Quilters Guild 30th anniversary. Board response - The Board appreciates the suggestion and will pass it along to the Historian, who is already working on the 30th anniversary program, tentatively planned for the May 2015 membership meeting.

Roseann Chalker made a motion to adjourn, Ann Davis seconded, motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:24 p.m. Minutes respectfully submitted by Ann Davis, Secretary.

2015 Guild Mystery

The 6-step Guild Mystery will begin **January 8, 2015** and is intended for Guild members only. You must have your quilt completed (pieced, quilted, and bound) by the October 2015 meeting. This year all of the mystery steps will be posted on the Guild website (www.valleyquiltersguild.com or www.valleyquiltersguild.org) and will be available, one step at a time, on the scheduled meeting day of each month, January through June. If you have trouble accessing the steps, please see one of the committee members or visit the Education Table for assistance.

Once again, we are being asked not to share any photos on any electronic device – no emails, no Twitter, no Facebook, etc. The designer uses this pattern as a mystery for other guilds and shops. Please abide by her request. Thank you!

2015 Challenge

Any member who wishes to participate will be given a fat quarter of batik fabric (Everyone gets the fat quarter from the same bolt of fabric.). Your fat quarter may be obtained by visiting the Education Table through September 2015 (or until fabric runs out). The completed items will be displayed at the 2015 October Annual Meeting. The reward is a fun project to keep or to give as a Christmas gift in 2015.

Challenge: (rules)

- Make any item that displays a "Quilting Technique", such as a quilt, table runners, place mats, purses, wearable art, stuffed animals, etc..
- Challenge Fabric must be on the front, or display side, of the item. Additional fabric, threads and embellishments are encouraged.
- No more than one Fat Quarter of Challenge Fabric may be used. (You may use less than the fat quarter.)

All classes begin at 10:00 am. Please be at the depot in plenty of time to get your area arranged. Remember to silence your cell phone and take all calls away from the class area.

Friends of Alaska CASA 18th Annual Silent Quilt Auction

There were 197 quilts donated by 92 quilters from Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Montana, Washington and even New Zealand at our 18th Annual CASA Quilt Auction on November 29, 2014. This year the quilts sold for \$21,175, raffle ticket sales were \$4,060, and cash donations were \$931, for a grand total of \$26,166. The following 41 extraordinarily generous Valley Quilters' Guild members donated 91 of the 197 quilts, representing \$8,785 of the quilt income:
